

# A Fond Farewell: Our First Female Engineer



1984 marked a significant milestone in SEPTA--the opening of Philadelphia's Commuter Rail Tunnel connecting Suburban Station with trains that formerly used the Reading Terminal Station. It was one of the most ambitious infrastructure projects undertaken in the city of Philadelphia.

Around the same time another historic event occurred in Philadelphia. Jackie Pettyjohn became the first female locomotive engineer for SEPTA. Pettyjohn first found the job opening at SEPTA through an ad in the Philadelphia Inquirer in August 1984 and few weeks later, the job was hers.

And last week yet another milestone was marked when Pettyjohn retired after an incredible 40-year career of dedicated service for SEPTA. Last Friday, she was surrounded by well-wishers after completing her final trip from Philadelphia International Airport to Suburban Station.

Pettyjohn's trailblazing legacy lives today on as out of 202 engineers, 35 are women.

# **System Safety: Confined Space Entry**

#### Defining Confined Space and System Safety's Confined Space Entry Program



What is confined space?

A confined space is an area that's not designed for regular human occupancy and has limited means of entry and exit:

- Size: It's large enough for a person to enter and perform work
- Atmosphere: It has a hazardous atmosphere, such as toxic substances or asphyxiation
- Entry and exit: It has limited or restricted means of entry or exit

Examples of confined spaces include:

- Tunnels
- Vaults
- Pits Manholes

Hoppers

 Equipment housings

Tanks

- Vessels
- Silos
- Storage bins

Confined spaces can present life-threatening hazards, including:

- Toxic substances
- Electrocutions

- Explosions
- Asphyxiation

System Safety's Confined Space Entry Program (#1003) purpose is to ensure the protection of all workers on SEPTA property from the hazards associated with confined space entry. This document contains requirements for practices and procedures to protect workers from those hazards of entry into and tasks within confined spaces.

It shall be the policy of SEPTA to reduce the need for confined space entry. It shall also be the policy of SEPTA to eliminate, whenever possible, all confined space hazards in order to reclassify permit-required confined spaces to non-permit required confined spaces. When confined space entry is necessary, all provisions of this document are to be followed.




